- recognize the importance of the mother tongue and identity as integral in the learning process

Skills

Teachers should

- be proven excellent classroom teachers
- have sound IT skills and a passion for embracing innovation
- have excellent inter-cultural communication skills
- have good time management and organizational skill



- be able to work in teams
- be capable of leading when necessary
- be adaptable, positive and pioneering; demonstrating resilience in a school start- up setting.

International School Delft values the following:

- international-mindedness
- prior experience of working in an international school
- experience in International Baccalaureate curriculum development
- a good track record in collaborative planning and working

Personal qualities

Teachers should have

- an empathy with and a willingness to care for children
- a sense of humour
- initiative
- an ability to take criticism and a willingness to act upon it
- an interest in contributing new ideas
- a willingness to learn, including the Dutch language
- reliable
- self-critical, committed to self-development and able to see the benefit of professional appraisal for personal growth

Qualifications

Teaching staff should have

- a teaching qualification that is or will be recognised by the Dutch authorities
- sound academic qualifications
- further qualifications and experience in training, coaching and presenting workshops are welcomed

Personal circumstances

International School Delft staff should have a desire to live in The Netherlands.

Teaching staff should be energetic, and role models for fit and healthy lifestyles. Staff should show commitment to their role in the school as well as to after school hours.
