Admissions

The general criteria for admission are: The student:

- has a non-Dutch nationality or is a foreign passport holder and one of the parents/legal guardians is employed in The Netherlands;
- or has a Dutch nationality and has lived and attended school abroad for at least two years as one of the parents/legal guardians was stationed abroad;
- or has a Dutch nationality and has a parent/legal guardian (with whom the student will be living) who will be stationed abroad within two years.

The MYP school programme should be designed to fit with the student's needs and the student should benefit from the programme.

Starting August 2023, we start with the first year of the IB Diploma Programme.
