Who is eligible to attend ISD?

International School Delft warmly welcomes students of all nationalities, faiths, beliefs, and cultures.

Students may qualify for a place at the International School Delft if ¹:

- A. The student has a non-Dutch nationality/is a foreign passport holder and one of the parents/legal guardians is employed in The Netherlands for a period of time; or
- B. The student has Dutch nationality and has lived and attended school(s) abroad for at least two years immediately prior to applying to ISD because one of the parents/legal guardians was living abroad and cannot access Dutch education.
- C. The student has Dutch nationality and has a parent/legal guardian (with whom the student will be living) who will be living abroad within two years and for at least two years (this should be supported by a written statement of intent by parent or employer).

Admission to the International School Delft (ISD) will be dependent upon the school programme being appropriate for the applicant's needs and places available. ISD Primary offers the IB Primary Years Programme (IB PYP) and Secondary offers the IB Middle Years Programme (IB MYP) and the IB Diploma Programme (IB DP).

Whether the school is appropriate for the student is determined by previous school reports, personal interviews, details of any Special Educational Needs and contact with previous school(s). In 2026-2027, at the secondary school, MYP years 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 will be open to students with a wide range of abilities, who can prove that they are able to follow the IB MYP curriculum. This will be determined by (previous) school reports, personal interviews, and any other data such as cognitive ability tasks, which the school considers relevant. The two-year Diploma Programme (DP1 and DP2) is a challenging programme designed by the International Baccalaureate as a pre-university package of learning. Admission to DP is dependent on whether a student is considered able to complete the course with success. This will be determined by (previous) school reports, personal interviews, and any other data which the school considers relevant.

Prospective parents should complete the forms on our online Admissions system OpenApply at <https://isdelft.openapply.com>

Parents/guardians will be asked to set up an account in OpenApply which will enable them to log in and view the status of their application process. It will also enable parents/guardians to upload the required documents, such as a copy of the student's passport and reports from previous school(s), where applicable, and communicate with the Admissions Team.

Application Fee

For the school to be able to start the appraisal of any application, an application fee of €250 should be transferred to an ISD bank account set up for this purpose. Proof of payment of the fee should be uploaded before parents will be able to continue with the application process.

Please note that the payment of the application fee is non-refundable and does not guarantee a place in the school nor can any rights be attached to payment of the fee.

¹ Admission to the Dutch International School is subject to conditions in accordance with Dutch legislation.



Through OpenApply, the school will confirm the receipt of an application. An admission interview will be arranged on location or via video call. Admission to the school will only be confirmed once it has been approved by the Head/Deputy Head for Primary or the Head/Deputy Head for Secondary.

All payments should clearly display the student's name and the preferred year and class of enrolment.

For students transferring from ISD Primary to ISD Secondary, there is no application fee.

NB: the Dutch government regards primary and secondary schools as separate entities, it is a legal requirement to re-submit personal data of the student and the parents, including copies of a passport, for students transferring from ISD Primary upon application to ISD Secondary.

School Fees: General Information

International School Delft is a Dutch International School and therefore partially funded by the Dutch government and partially by parent contribution / school fee.

As an educational institute, we are a non-profit organisation. Our budget, income and expenses are fully committed to the quality of education and the school organisation in general.

The governing boards of Laurentius Stichting (Primary school) and Lucas Onderwijs (Secondary school) are responsible for the financial planning and control of both schools and the Leadership of both Primary and Secondary are responsible for the annual and multi-year financial planning and allocation of budgets for the schools.

The Participation Councils of both Primary and Secondary, including staff and parents' representatives, have the responsibility to advise and / or consent to policies and changes regarding



school organisation. Annually, they check the financial status of the organisation as well as the Standard Terms and Conditions to assure good governance of the school and fair and reasonable changes to policies and fees.

The school fees are established annually for the following academic year, taking into account, among other considerations, indexation/inflation.

In addition, the school reserves the right to further adjust the school fee in order to accommodate changes, such as in state funding of school fees, any increases in external examination fees, extension of facilities and programmes offered.

Acceptance Form

Once parents/guardians have accepted the offer of a place for their child, and ticked the acceptance box in OpenApply, they have agreed with and accepted the Standard Terms and Conditions 2026-2027, including the financial obligations.

Confidential Information and Data Privacy

The school complies with the Dutch legislation on privacy, but it is ISD's practice to show photographs and video footage of school activities and events on its website, in various school publications and on social media. The school may also include them in press releases and advertising.

To give permission to use images for this purpose, parents/guardians will be asked to sign a photo release form. Permission can be withdrawn in writing at any time, but not retrospectively.

Parents accept that it is the school's legal duty to provide data requested by the Government and other official authorities. However, this information will be limited to what is necessary to fulfil the legal requirements.

Invoicing and Payment

For the school fees and additional fees, the school will send invoices to all parents/guardians via email through the invoicing system, WisCollect. The invoices may be downloaded, and the details of invoiced amounts and the status of the payments may be viewed online by the parents/guardians through the link which they receive. Payment can be made online via iDeal (preferred) or by bank transfer to the bank account specified on the invoice.

Please note that there are separate accounts for Primary and Secondary!

For the 2026-27 academic year, invoices for school fees will be sent at the end of May / beginning of June 2026 to all parents/guardians of current ISD students, as well as to those with confirmed enrollment for the upcoming year.

Delay or Non-payment

Delays in fee payments will be addressed through the following procedure: an automatic reminder will be issued by the WisCollect system, followed by a reminder and/or warning from the Finance team. Fees that remain overdue for one month will subsequently result in a formal warning from the Head of School and will incur late payment interest in accordance with Dutch law, as well as an administrative penalty of 50 Euro. School reserves the right to charge all such late payments and penalties from the deposit.

Subsequently, any non-payment of fees may be transferred to the external debt collector, with all associated costs charged to the parent/guardian. Non-payment of fees will also affect the student's eligibility for re-enrolment. International School Delft may, in such cases, refer the student(s) concerned to a national public school programme. Please note that admission to these schools is not automatic.

Instalment Option

For the school fees only, there is an option for payment by instalments. The number of instalments depends on when the student joins the school, with the maximum number of instalments being eight, payable monthly – end of each month from 30 June 2026 to 31 January 2027.



If a student joins the school later than the beginning of the academic year, the instalments will be recalculated in equal amounts based on monthly payments till 31 January 2027. There is no instalment option available for students joining ISD after December 2026.

The condition for payment by instalments is that the payments are made per the due dates in accordance with the payment schedule provided by the school and WisCollect, and that the payee fulfilled these conditions in the preceding year.

For parents and guardians paying in instalments, all fees must be fully paid by 31 January 2027.

Requests to pay in instalments can be submitted until 30 May 2026 using the request form that will be distributed by the Finance team. The form should be mailed to:

Parents/guardians will receive a confirmation with a payment plan.

Please note that payment of schools fees in full before the deadline of 30 June 2026 will attract a discount, as specified in the school fees breakdown.

Additional payments

Curriculum-related trips and activities may occur throughout the academic year for which additional costs will apply.

Also, the fees and costs exclude any additional charges for specialist learning support, after-school clubs, mother-tongue lessons, official exam retakes and re-marks.

DP2 Exams

DP2 students take their final secondary school exams and specify regulations and fees apply for this group. These exams occur in April/May of the DP2 year, following the official IB calendar (IBO.org). Results are usually released at the beginning of July. A fee is charged for sitting the exams; this includes costs paid to the IB as well as administrative costs incurred by the school.

If a student does not achieve the required points to graduate with an IB Diploma or is unsuccessful in a number of subjects, they can request a re-mark of the exam or a re-take of no more than 3 subjects in November. If a student is 3 points below the required total of 24 points, ISD strongly recommends the student to redo the entire DP2 year and take the exams in May of the following year. For more information on the process of repeating subjects in DP we refer to the '*Whole school Assessment and Promotion Policy- section Promotion into DP*'.

Fees and attendance rules

- Separate fees apply for re-sits and re-marking. The fees for this are shown in the table.
- If a student is over 18 years old, they generally do not need to attend classes before retakes, and no additional school fees will be charged.

However, students must attend school in the following cases:

- Re-taking 2 or more DP subjects in November: If the student attends classes for those subjects, 50% of the DP2 school fee will be charged.
- Repeating any subject while under 18 at the start of the next academic year and remaining in the Netherlands: Dutch law requires full attendance for repeated subjects. This will also be charged at 50% of the DP2 school fee.
- Repeating the full DP2 year and sitting exams in May of the following year: Full DP2 fees will be charged.



All re-sit examination fees have to be paid in full before re-sit registrations are done by the school. Additionally, if a student transfers from ISD to another school to complete the re-sit exams, they need to pay the fees to ISD before the transfer is done.

Deposit

The deposit of €500, which is charged to all new ISD students, is a once-only charge and is refundable on leaving ISD when school property has been returned and there are no outstanding financial obligations. If a student transfers from Primary to Secondary and the deposit was paid in Primary, the deposit will be automatically transferred to Secondary.

Technology in Secondary

Secondary students in MYP years 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, as well as in DP1 and DP2, will use a MacBook for work both at school and at home.

Students of all year groups may purchase their own MacBook, with the required specifications (see Technology Specifications 2026-27). As a sustainable school, we encourage students to purchase refurbished MacBooks (please see possible suppliers of refurbished MacBooks in the Netherlands in the technology specifications document). Students who own their laptops are strongly advised to take out insurance cover with an option of replacement in case of device malfunction or have other options for ensuring accessibility of a laptop in case their device breaks.

For the new Students in MYP 4, 5 and DP1, 2, it is mandatory to purchase their own MacBooks with the required specifications, as we do not offer a lease contract for these years. Alternatively, new students in MYP 1, 2, and 3 have an option to lease a new MacBook from the school under a school lease contract (including insurance), which needs to be requested in the enrollment / application form. After the contract fees have been fully paid during a 3-year period, the MacBook becomes the property of the student. Technology fees are invoiced annually for students with a laptop contract (school year 2023-2024 or later) during the contract period which is normally three years. If the laptop is returned during the 3-year period, fees for each full school year apply and if the student leaves during the school year, the same pro-rata fee applies for that year as for the school fees.

Summary:

Students and parents / guardians have two options for the required laptop:

- A) Purchase their own MacBook, according to the technology specifications 2026-27 (see Technology Specifications 2026-27 on the school website). This MacBook will not fall under any insurance effected through the school and responsibility for maintenance / repairs will remain with the student, as well as ensuring that they have an alternative device to use for school assignments while their device is unavailable. Or:
- B) New students joining MYP 1, 2, 3 can sign a contract with ISD for the lease of a school MacBook. The lease fee is payable for a period of three years, in three annual instalments. After the three years' lease period, the MacBook becomes the property of the student. New MacBooks include a 3-year insurance (see MacBook contract). The school's insurance company has a limited number of MacBooks available as replacement devices in case the insured device becomes unusable, but a replacement device cannot be guaranteed.



Withdrawal From School and Refund Policy

Parents/guardians of students who are withdrawing are required to download and submit a leaving form to the school administration. Unless full notice is given by submitting the completed leaving form 60 days in advance, fees will continue to be charged. Please refer to the refund table further in the document. Students leaving ISD are required to clear all obligations before final records are released to the next school and the deposit is refunded.
